

Gary was always a selfless volunteer, whether he took his turn as Brad's Boy Scout Troop Committee Chairman in 1969 (Gary never achieved Eagle Scout status as a teenager because his Scoutmaster wouldn't sign him off thinking Gary was too young!); being the assistant coach for Karen's softball team in 1971; being the adult leader for Eric's YMCA Indian Guides in 1971, tirelessly soliciting corporate donations for the Washington Childrens Home Society in the '70's & '80's; being the Hoodspout Port Commissioner in the 2000's; to being the Chairman of the Potlatch Beach Mutual Water Board the last fifteen years of his life.



First Meet Scheduled Tomorrow

The lid comes off the 1954 high school track season tomorrow afternoon as Bremerton's Wildcats trek to Port Orchard for a dual meeting with the South Kitsap Wolves.

The meet, first of the year for both of the cross-bay rivals, is scheduled to get under way with the weight events at approximately 1:30.

The first running event will start at 2 p.m.

BOTH TEAMS have primed for the event under relatively good conditions. South Kitsap went through its first time trials late last week, while the Wildcats have been working against the clock off and on for over a week.

Bremerton, county and peninsula meet champion last year, has suffered heavily via graduation, especially in the running events.

Long returns there are dash man Rick (Whitely) Williams and miler Harry Murray. Both of these lads were clear finishers to Ron Vehn and Don Jenkins last year.

Williams will compete in both the 100 and 220 along with Jack Alexander, the football player making his first try at the cinder sport.

Murray, bigger and stronger than last year when he posted a top mark of 4:35 in the mile, is expected to be one of Bremerton's top point-getters. He'll share the mile duties with promising sophomore, Mel Alexander, up from Coonix.

COACH KEN WILLS rated his other running events as only fair. "We'll have to wait until after this first meet and maybe more after that before finding out just what we have there," he said.

Don Kieckhafer, a sophomore from Coonix, and senior Art Sherman are the top entries in the 440, while Don Anderson, who saw some competition last year, Tony Baxter and Steve Lee will compete in the 880.

Most glowing of the hurdle prospects is sophomore Ken Osen, a youngster Wills figures will do well in the highs. For the lows, letterman Jerry Cain is back along with junior Jim Pharr and sophomore Pat White.

Wayne Murker, the big guy who holds the all-time Bremerton high mark in the discus, heads up the weight department.

A senior now, Murker will compete in the discus as well as the shot put. Gary Carlberg and sophomore Jack Bergin are other shot-putters.

FOR THE JAVELIN, Wills has Jerry Peterson, John Wagner and Gary Hessel. Sophomore Al Murphy will compete in some of the weight events, also.

Wagner and Ray Shaw are back in the pole vault. The former also will compete in the broad jump with Cain. Cain, Ardis Clinton and Sherman form the high jump field.

South Kitsap has a potentially strong team. Bolstered by such veterans as Larry Lake, Don McLeod and Ken Walters, the Wolves could well rate the edge over Bremerton in tomorrow's meeting.


